A-Arrive on time, prepared and ready to listen

R - Respect yourself and others

T-Try your best

These can so easily be taken for granted, however, without such aspirations our daily environment becomes infinitely poorer. The simplicity of saying please and thank you makes a significant and lasting first impression. Friendships, new and old, are what make life at Musikili so enriching. The importance of appreciating punctuality and having an invested interest in what others have to say, enables learning to take place. Respect for yourself and others provides the foundation for the aforementioned to be developed. The desire to try your best, no matter the situation, reveals those with the key characteristic of GRIT.

I urge our parents to ensure that we hold our children accountable and to encourage them to be 'SMART'. It is a team effort between school and parents, to develop children who live this acronym. It has been interesting to watch our children going about their daily routines this week, mostly caught up in the excitement of being reunited with friends, amidst settling back into the structures of school and boarding life. Unfortunately, what has been clearly evident, is how many children have forgotten the importance of being, 'SMART'.







The staffing body has found the need to be more assertive in reminding children of our school rules and their responsibility to uphold them. Mr. Weinrich spent the better part of last week dealing with a number of children who had transgressed, showing scant regard for school rules. It is a disappointing trait that seems to creep into the schooling system, however, with a zero tolerance approach I believe we will soon be putting these unfortunate behaviours behind us. The return of our younger children, normal evening routines, responsibilities and a fuller programme have brought back a greater normality to all proceedings. I thank all the relevant parents for their outstanding support in helping us deal with the issues that arose.

The return of our younger children has added a great deal of life to our campus and the sound of younger voices, playful behaviour and a whole element of 'cute', quickly reminded us of what we had been missing over the past months. The children were quick to embrace the chance to be back in the classroom, the boarding house and to resume sporting routines. There has been some adaption required to the longer days and increased academic demands, but in all we have enjoyed a successful return to school.

I can appreciate that there are some parents who still experience some anxiety around Covid-19. The staff have all been briefed on the importance of trying to instil the new expectations around social distancing, wearing masks and avoiding unnecessary contact. I assure you, that it is no easy task trying to keep children apart, from holding hands and from walking shoulder to shoulder. These behaviours reflect the atmosphere that exists at Musikili. Our teachers and teaching assistants work tirelessly to insist that our children sanitize hands and abide to protocol, as far as reasonably possible, to try and establish habitual behaviour. Our afternoon programme provides the opportunity for children to be children, however, at this time we have avoided activities that require too much physicalcontact. More and more official studies reveal the resistance that children have towards Covid-19 and we believe that our environment, is even more conducive to healthy living.

I must remind all parents to continue with responsible parenting and should their child be showing any flu like symptoms, please keep them at home. Our staff are prepared to provide any necessary work to be done at home in these circumstances. Parents visiting our campus are to ensure that they wear a mask, especially if they are interacting with children and staff.

We are delighted to be able to announce that we have secured the services of an incredible teaching couple, Mr. and Mrs. Price Moor, who will be joining us in January 2021 to fulfil the roles of Grade 7 and Grade 3 class teachers.
