Introduction

Early Years and Grade R – 3 fall under the Junior Phase department and is over seen by Mrs. Samantha Hein. The Early Years and Grade R class caters for children aged 3 to 6 years of age and is under the guidance and expertise of Mrs. Belinda Bray who is a Pre-School specialist with many years of experience. Grade 1 caters for children who turn 6 in that academic year, however, due to the expatriate community in Zambia, South African children generally start Grade 1 the year they turn 7. Musikili Primary also has a Satellite school in Lusaka for Grades 1 and 2.



True education begins long before exams are even on the horizon: the way we are taught in our early years has a huge influence on our long-term love of learning and the person we will eventually become. Instead of hot-housing, we give children the most precious gift of all – time. It's only by having time to explore new concepts that a child is able to ask the questions that might not have occurred to anyone else, to make connections to their past experiences, and to become fully immersed in a subject. Our creative early years curriculum sees classes choosing a new topic every term or half term, with everything they learn during that time linking to the theme as much as possible. This makes learning far more meaningful for the children and, because they are involved in investigating the topic and have a say in what they will study, they become active rather than passive learners. Some of the most valuable learning in these early years happens outside the classroom and we aim to provide as many opportunities as we can for children to explore the world. With this in mind, each class goes on a fact-finding mission when a new topic is introduced by making the best use of technology or by simply engaging with our incredible surroundings. Teaching in the Foundation Phase is predominantly by class teachers except for PE, Art, Music, ICT and additional language, which are taught by specialists. There is no formal homework – just regular reading, spellings and times tables to learn – and although we assess children regularly, there are no formal exams. Our aim in the Foundation Phase is to create a lively and vibrant environment which promotes an independence of spirit, a willingness to 'have a go' and a determination to succeed.

Academic Programme

We strive to give children a holistic education and expose them to as many learning opportunities as possible.

We follow the Number Sense Programme from Grade R -7 which is proving to be very fruitful as children are challenged to think in different ways, recognize number patterns and problem solve using a variety of strategies.

We follow the Jolly Phonics programme which is a recognized programme that teaches synthetic phonics which helps the children learn letter recognition and sounds and apply them to the learning of reading and spelling.

Each term Grade 1 – 7 takes part in a Project Week which inspires creativity and problem solving.

All grades go on a minimum of one Outdoor Ed trip. Early Years – Grade 1 go on a day trip. Grade 2 has a 1 night sleepover trip and Grade 3 enjoy a 2 night sleepover trip. Outdoor Ed in the Junior Phase is hosted by community members, friends of Musikili and parents.







Specialist Lessons

Specialist lessons include P.E, Music, Art, Library, Computers, French and Design and Technology.

- Cross country

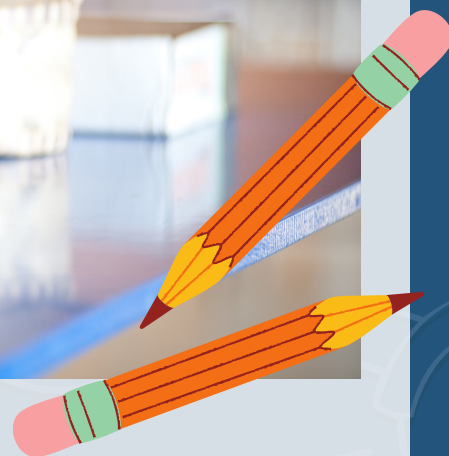


Private Coaching

Private coaching in Tennis, Cricket and Hockey is offered. This is a private arrangement with the relevant coaches and payment is settled directly with the coaches concerned.





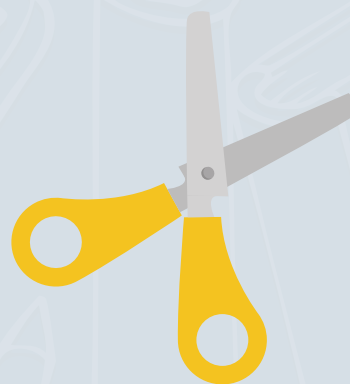

Please provide your child with the following items at the beginning of the school year. Stationery items need to be clearly labelled with your child's name.

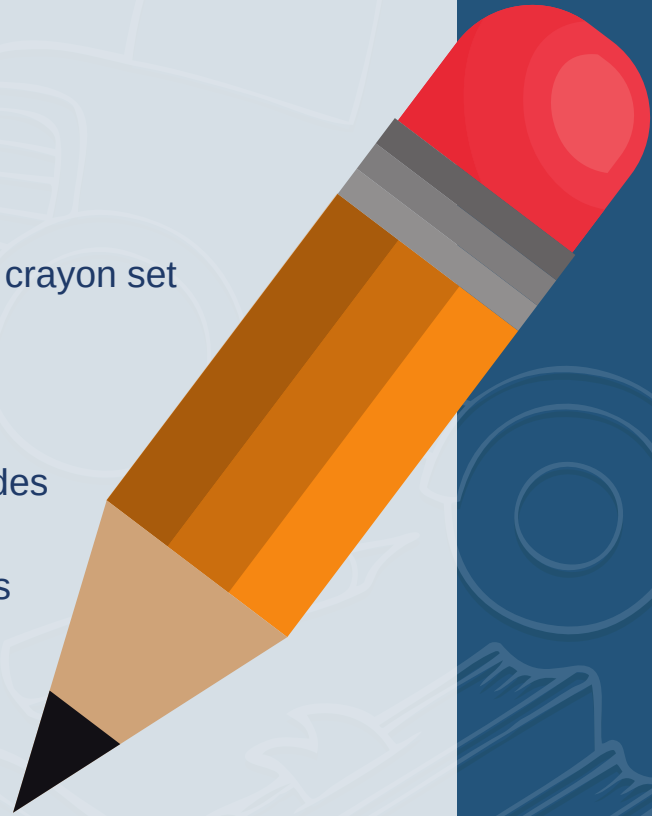

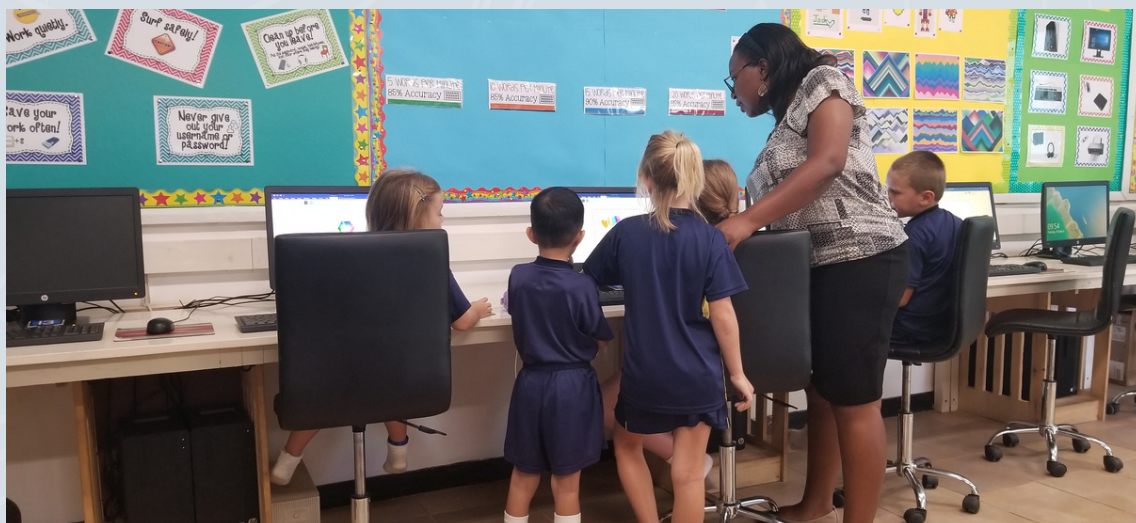

Uniform & Hair

School uniform is worn every Monday and Friday.
Sports kit is worn Tuesday – Thursday.

Summer School Uniform

Boys – Blue uniform shirt, Navy blue school shorts, Long grey socks, Black school shoes, Rafters.

Girls – School dress, white ankle socks, Back school shoes, Rafters

Sports Kit

Boys – Sports shirt, Sports shorts, white ankle socks, takkies, swimming costume

Winter School uniform

All pupils clothing and belongings must be clearly marked.



School Fees

School Fees Payable termly in advance or as per financial arrangement made with the Head of School in writing.

Sundries

Parents will be notified of any additional costs and these will be added to your sundry account. This account is to be settled by the end of term, or at the latest before the commencement of the following term. Non negotiable.

Termination

Termination of enrolment is required to be received a Term in advance and is to be addressed to the Headmaster. Notice that is submitted late will incur a financial penalty.





Bus Services

There is a weekly Musikili bus service for children who live in Lusaka or Choma as well as a daily bus service for the children who live in Mazabuka.

Choma

Pick up at 06.30 at Choma Golf Club every Monday morning.
Drop off at 14.30 at Choma Golf Club every Friday afternoon.

Mazabuka

Pick up at 06.30 at Mazabuka Golf Club, Tuesday to Friday.
Drop off at 17.30 at Mazabuka Golf Club, Monday to Thursday.

Please note, there is no bus service from Mazabuka on Monday morning or Friday afternoon
